

Cookie Policy

Effective on 01 August 2019

At International Housing Solutions (Pty) Ltd ('IHS'), we believe in being clear and open about how we collect and use data related to you. In the spirit of transparency, this policy provides detailed information about how and when we use cookies. This cookie policy applies to any IHS product or service that links to this policy or incorporates it by reference.

Does IHS use cookies?

Yes. As described in [Section 2.1 of our Privacy Policy](#), we use cookies and other technologies to ensure everyone who uses IHS has the best possible experience. By continuing to visit or use our services, you are agreeing to the use of cookies and similar technologies for the purposes we describe in this policy.

What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small file placed onto your device that enables IHS features and functionality. For example, cookies enable us to identify your device, secure your access to IHS and our sites generally. Cookies also enable you to easily share content on IHS.

When does IHS place cookies?

We use cookies on our site, <https://www.ihsinvestments.co.za/>. Any browser visiting this site may receive cookies from us.

What types of cookies does IHS use?

We use session cookies that last for as long as the session (usually the current visit to a website or a browser session).

What are cookies used for?

Cookies can be used to recognize you when you visit IHS, remember your preferences, and give you a personalized experience that's in line with your settings. Cookies also make your interactions with IHS faster and more secure.

What third-party cookies does IHS use?

IHS doesn't use any third-party cookies on our sites.

Controlling cookies

Most browsers allow you to control cookies through their settings preferences. However, if you limit the ability of websites to set cookies, you may worsen your overall user experience, since it will no longer be personalized to you. It may also stop you from saving customized settings like login information.

Authentication	If you're signed in to IHS, cookies help us show you the right information and personalize your experience.
Security	We use cookies to enable and support our security features, and to help us detect malicious activity and violations of our User Agreement.
Preferences, features and services	Cookies can tell us which language you prefer and what your communications preferences are. They can help you fill out forms on IHS more easily.
Advertising	IHS will never use your details for advertising purposes.
Performance, Analytics and Research	Cookies help us learn how well our website perform.

What is Do Not Track (DNT)?

DNT is a concept that has been promoted by regulatory agencies such as the U.S. Federal Trade Commission (FTC), for the Internet industry to develop and implement a mechanism for allowing Internet users to control the tracking of their online activities across websites by using browser settings. The World Wide Web Consortium (W3C) has been working with industry groups, Internet browsers, technology companies, and regulators to develop a DNT technology standard. While some progress has been made, it has been slow. No standard has been adopted to this date. As such, IHS does not generally respond to “do not track” signals.

What to do if you don't want cookies to be set or want them to be removed?

If you do not want to receive cookies, you can change your browser settings on your computer or other device you're using to access our services. If you use IHS without changing your browser settings, we'll assume that you're happy to receive all cookies on the IHS website. Most browsers also provide functionality that lets you review and erase cookies, including IHS cookies. Please note that the IHS site may not work properly without cookies.
